Then on to EPA and then exemptions for us. I will keep you informed, pictures if I can.



TECH TALK

Spitfire Starting Aid By Dave Reynolds BRG '67 Spitfire

There's always been a cold start problem with S.U. Carbureters, so I rigged up a propane starting aid for my '67 Spitfire. I now live in Casper, Wyoming, and still drive it most every day, except when dangerously icy, even if it's zero. Before, even with the mixture knob all the way out, it didn't help much and the starter was working itself to a premature grave.



I modified an old propane torch valve and ran a 1/4 plastic tube to a fitting on the intake manifold, and now, I crack open the propane valve, turn the key, and it starts. A few seconds later, when the engine smooths out on gasoline, I close the valve. There's enough propane injected to overenrich, so some adjustments needed to be learned.

Enrichment can also be had by connecting the propane line to the distributor's vacuum advance line. This is a little different since the entry to the carbureter is ahead of the throttle, and a slight throttle opening is needed to start. My vacuum advance is working; yours probably isn't, so if you use this route, don't let propane escape via a leaking advance diaphragm.


Clearly understand some important safety issues: You proceed at your own risk, and modifying approved hardware eliminates all safety approvals. That said, the propane bottle is lots stronger than that tin can of a gas tank you now have. Propane is stenched so you'll smell a leak far below the combustible mixture point.

I took the flame director off the torch and drilled a 3/16 hole into the center of the flame end, and just inside was a nice sintered brass filter material. I soldered an inch of 3/16 brake line into the drilled hole, to create a place to squeeze the plastic tubing over. You need a major league soldering iron to do this, or an experienced torch hand, and acid core solder.

My intake manifold has an 1/8 inch pipe threaded hole centered in the balance tube, and I put a tubing fitting there. The tubing is the same stuff you use to pipe water to your evaporative coolers, and I routed it through the firewall hole with the main wire loom on the driver's side, over the transmission hump, and to the area in front of the passenger seat. That's where the propane bottle with it's modified valve lives.

Under the hood, I routed the tube behind the coil and windscreen washer on the firewall and a fairly straight shot to the manifold fitting. I Stayed atop the engine, away from exhaust heat.

I have my hard top installed for winter and the little Spitfire is very cozy. I still think of all my friends at DCTRA down there in the valley of the sun. I'll think of you next summer, too.

Kart Racing By Dave Riddle

Yesterday three of us (My son Tyler (12), his teammate from the AIKC - http://www.racingschools.com/imecorp/Az_indoor_karting.shtml - series, William Herr (14) and I) competed as a team for a 200 lap (100 mile) race on the half mile GP course at F1 Race Factory.

We decided to have Tyler run the qualifying session for us to determine our grid position. The track was in the same direction and configuration it had been run in for a race that Tyler and William had run two weeks prior and since Tyler had the faster time and because I had never run the track in this configuration it only made sense to have Tyler make the attempt.

In the lottery we drew the exact same kart for this race as the boys had driven the last time they drove together - lucky #13. Tyler went out with the second group of 8 karts for the 10 lap qualifying session and for the first nine laps he held the 2nd fastest time throughout the session running in the mid to low 48's and kept bringing his time down with almost every lap. Finally on the last lap he got his time down into the 47's to take the fast time for the group.

49.99, 48.89, 48.59, 48.45, 48.77, 48.39, 48.12, 48.21, 48.76 and then 47.90

His hold on first however only lasted until the Team that had been holding first for the entire session crossed the stripe with a time of 47.86 to just squeak out a better time.

Once all the times from the two qualifying sessions were combined Tyler had earned the Team a 5th place starting position on the grid out of a field of 16 karts.

Because Tyler had been the lead driver when he and William last ran together we elected to have William take the lead this time to be followed by Tyler taking over duties at the first pit stop (lap 70) and then I would jump into the kart at about lap 140 when we would do the last mandated pit stop and perform the required refueling to make it to the end of the race.

At the start the kart bogged on launch and William found himself shuffled back to about 13th and then he battled back to as high as 8th before getting caught allowing the leaders through on a couple blue flag which opened the door for the karts directly behind him to squeeze by and punt him down to 10th at the end of his stint with a fast lap of 47.77 and an average time of 48.84 for his 68 actual race laps.

The pit crew of Benn and Dave further increased our efficiency of yanking a driver out of his seat and stuffing a new one in with this pit stop. In the first race of this year for William and Tyler we managed to swap them out with an outlap of 76.22 in the second race we reduced this time to a 70.65 and in the race yesterday we got it down to a 64.58!

Tyler rejoined the hunt in 11th place and since most teams seemed to be on a similar pit stop rotation our work in the pits helped Tyler to claw the team back up to a 7th place position and recorded a fast lap of 47.26 (average time of 48.21 for the 46 laps for which there is data - the balance of his stint and all of my stint were not provided on the timesheets, including the lap where Tyler recorded the Teams fastest time.) before turning the driving duties over to Dad.

While I was nowhere near as quick as the boys with a fast time of only about 49.5 with the 8th place kart being about .5 to a full second faster than I was the pit work of Benn flashing laptimes, position and lap count at me as I went into T2 as well as pointing to the position of where the kart behind us was helped get me to kick it into gear to keep pushing and we finished the race still in 7th position with Benn now having to help me

out of the kart! If the race had gone a few laps longer I don't know if I could have held off the challenge from the kart behind us. I am glad the timing sheet only recorded times through lap 115 so that NONE of my lap times have being recorded for posterity!

Reviewing the lap sheets and the fast times by each of the teams it was

really interesting to see that the final ranking actually mirrored exactly

the ranking of fastest laps during the race.

1 46.30; 2 46.57;3 46.59; 4 46.77; 5 46.86; 6 47.17; 7 47.26 <<< Team Kart Design; 8 47.48; 9 47.64; 10 47.65;11 47.70; 12 48.02; 13 48.32; 14 48.66;15 49.20; 16 50.01.

Next up for Tyler is a practice day on his 80cc shifter kart tommorow evening then a test day this coming Saturday on a TAG kart for the local EasyKart Shop/dealer (http://tms-racing.com/) out at the local sprint track.

Tyler and William will next hit the track together as competitors on 4/16/05 on the East track at Firebird running with SCK/SWK (http://www.socalkarters.net) followed the next day as teammates for Round 3 of the AIKC series.
