Visitors:

No visitors, but Stu welcomed the newer members he hasn't met and asked Don Becker to introduce himself. Don joined last May and has a 1974 Mallard Blue TR6. Thanks Don!

MINUTES from February meeting:

No one reported any revisions or corrections to last month's meeting minutes published in the newsletter, nor were any changes made tonight. As such, the minutes were moved and accepted as published in the February Triumph Trumpeter newsletter

TREASURER

Kathy Nuss, Treasurer, read her report. She also reported separately on the Election Brunch as follows: \$1433.14 to Claim Jumpers restaurant, \$87.45 for the champagne, less \$980.00 collected from the 49 members who attended for total \$540.60 paid by DCTRA for the luncheon. A copy of the Treasurer's report was provided to the Secretary.

MEMBERSHIP

Dave Freet, Membership Chair, apologized for his email regarding membership renewals. He reported we officially have 196 memberships on the rolls going back to 2005. 96 are paid currently for total of 149 persons. Of the other 100 memberships we are carrying on the books, 23 have not renewed for this year, 37 have not renewed since 2013 and 40 have not renewed since 2010. As a reminder only those current in dues are members and memberships are terminated automatically for failure to pay annual dues by March 31st of each year.

Dave Freet also reported on the new member packets. We spend at least \$19 for the membership packets that includes a name badge for each member (two badges if both are on one membership), one lapel pin, a DCTRA static-cling sticker for windshield, the president's welcome letter, club history, bylaws, recommended businesses and a club business card. Our dues of \$18 do not cover the cost of creating this new membership packet and postage for mailing should the new member not attend club meetings for an extended period of time. Dave proposes to email the welcome letter, bylaws and other information to save cost of copying and mailing. That would leave only the name badge(s), pin and business card to mail (if necessary) for postage cost of \$0.90 to \$1.25.

Additionally, Dave reported he sent the membership list to Dave Riddle but the website was not updated. He then asked what information should be on the posted membership list. Should it be a minimum such as your name, city and email address or all information? Not everyone may want their personal information viewable by others. There was much discussion that the membership list can serve to bring people together with a common interest because there may be members in your neighborhood or with the same car. It was also suggested that any truncated information be on an exception basis and not across all memberships. Stu took an action to contact Dave Riddle about the broken website and to get with Club officers regarding the membership list how much info will be made available.

NEWSLETTER

George Montgomery reported the newsletter is published and available. He reminded us to please contribute information, news and pictures for inclusion into a future Triumph Trumpeter newsletter.

EVENTS

Matt Reynolds, VP and Events, reported on upcoming events as per below. Look for email from Matt for other events as well.

- March 14 John Horton's Garage Day on March 14 at his house (40th Lane & Greenway in Phoenix) from about 9-3; John will send details in an upcoming email; and thought that he would have several during the year. Also, look for emails from Matt of upcoming events.
- March 20 & 21 Highland Games and Car Show at Indian Steele Park, where there is an opportunity to display your car on Saturday for free and register for a popular vote show on Sunday.
- April 18/19 The B.E.A.T. The annual overnight run Phoenix to Flagstaff.
- April 18 Copper state Cruise-In at Tempe Diablo Stadium 9 AM-2 PM. Copper state cars depart at 12 noon. See the 90 cars participating in the 2015 Copper state 1000. Bring your own cool ride. Enjoy the food trucks, beer garden and automotive scenery.
- May 1//2 Rt. 66 Fun Run
- July TBD Armand is planning a "Swim-In" movie night at his house to enjoy the pool and a movie!

Arizona Automobile Hobbyist Council (A.A.H.C):

The A.A.H.C provides updates on Toll Roads and other Legislative Issues pertinent to the automobile hobbyist. The DCTRA usually sends a representative each month to their meetings. This month as promised John and Beth Horton attended the AAHC meeting and provided the following.

HB2423 Real ID (federal) driver license: Effective 2016 a federal driver license is required (one that meets Department of Homeland Security identification requirements). Otherwise you will not be able to fly within in the US without this type of license or a US passport. Most states comply AZ does not at this time. Depending on the outcome if AZ does not comply by end of year an Arizona citizen will be able to request a federal driver's license but will have to pay for it.

SB1061 increased fuel tax: This is still going through the legislature and may or may not happen.

SB1107 License Plate Covers: This was concerning covering up the state name on the license plate, but now has been expanded to make illegal the use any film or plastic that distorts a clear license image from being photographed.

SB1146 Personalized Classic Plates: You may have the opportunity to buy a classic personalized copper plate.

John also reported that from 2 years ago Phase 1 of the Toll Roads in Arizona is moving along; they are looking into a per-mile charging system to use the roads (a \$.50/per mile charge may be possible) with collection for it turned over to a private/foreign company. This is not far-fetched. Oregon is going to be the first state to launch this system later this year on a limited basis. Program participants will pay 1.5 cents per mile driven in lieu of paying Oregon's 30 cents per gallon gasoline tax. All other states will be watching. So will Arizona. John brought in a petition the AAHC is circulating for no toll roads in AZ for us to sign. Make your comments known to SPINE@AZMAG.GOV. As an aside: The Maricopa Association of Governments (MAG), in partnership with the Federal Highway Administration and the Arizona Department of Transportation, launched this study to develop a Corridor Master Plan for the Interstate 10 and Interstate 17 corridor. This corridor is referred to as the "Spine," because it serves as the backbone for transportation in the metropolitan Phoenix area. In fact, the corridor handles more than 40 percent of all daily freeway traffic in the region. See AAHC website at this link: https://www.arizonaautomobilehobbyistcouncil.com/

TECHNICAL

Armand LaCasse had some non-Triumph information regarding doing a very quick install of a drive shaft on a car he drove tonight – how was this possible? Front-wheel drive!

Someone asked if you can you add too much ZDP to your motor oil? No one really knew the answer and too much of a good thing may not be good. Be careful.

John Nuss is passing this tip from the DKW website where they showed someone using molasses (successfully) to remove rust from a much rusted crankshaft.

Jim Bauder told of making a very useful tool out of a "church key."

John Horton had a tip for recharging an aerosol can such as getting the rest of the paint out of a spray can (e.g. Krylon) after the air is depleted. Go to local tire store and get a regular rubber valve stem. Put that over the top of the can (nozzle removed) and give it a careful quick hit with the air hose. It recharges the can and you can get the rest of the product out.

OLD BUSINESS

The discussion from last month regarding using Club money to purchase various items for a gift basket (or two) that will be used as a raffle prize for the BEAT tour. The email comments and suggestions from various members in response to Denine's letter to DCTRA in the days before tonight's meeting shows the members like the idea of promoting Triumphs and the DCTRA in this manner, but showed that this is more of a systemic issue for the Club in using its funds and not just to this event; that we should be setting things up at the beginning of year on spending so it won't become an issue.

Tonight's discussion on the gift basket for the BEAT tour varied. A motion was made and seconded to pass the hat and use that money for the gift basket. The motion did not pass. Denine thanked everyone who offered to donate money for the basket. Further, if individual money is used, then the gift basket would only be from those individuals, not the DCTRA.

A second motion was made to provide \$120 to purchase various items to make up a basket or two that will be used as a raffle prize for the BEAT. The motion was seconded and discussed. The motion passed. A check for \$120 was issued to Denine for the BEAT gift basket. This would be a gift and not a donation because it is not going to a non-profit organization.

Stu took an action for the Board to meet and discuss the various issues raised tonight including funding/budget for gifts of this sort, club events where food and drink is provided, other donations a member may want to give in future to the various car events and rallies or shows to which DCTRA members participate including Holiday donations made at the end of the year.

NEW BUSINES

Jim Bauder came across a nice set of Triumph logo earrings and offered them to the Club tonight. Who wants them? Several people were interested so Stu held an auction for the earrings. The winning bid of \$20.00 came from Denine. Stu gave the money to Kathy for the DCTRA general fund.

Member Gary Revis announced he is selling a TR8 engine and automatic transmission for a reasonable offer and is looking for a crankshaft for a TR4A. He will send an email to the Newsletter.


