# A Timely Commentary: Rare and Valuable?

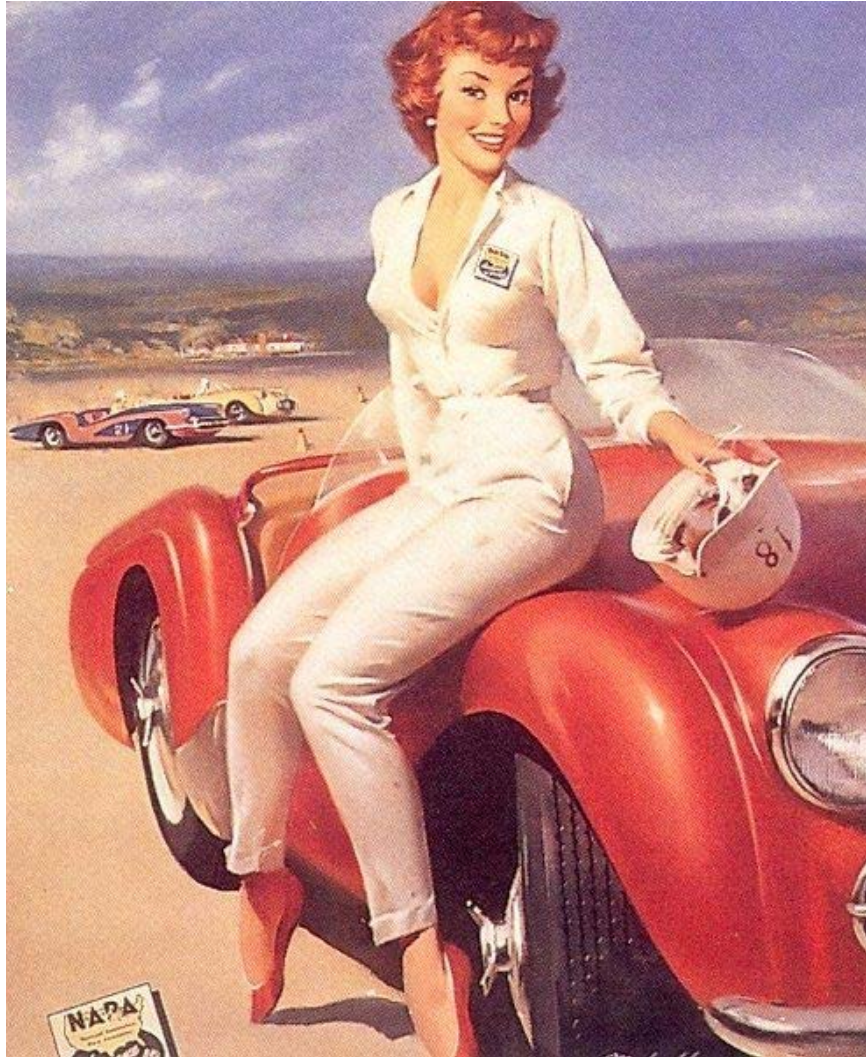
Here is the upside. Last Tuesday Bob Holt and I visited a ninety-four year old Triumph enthusiast, Roger. I was glad to have Bob along with me, I would have looked at the car – over and under inside and out, asked the owner his price and been on my way. I would have missed a cool part of the trip. Thanks to Bob we spent time talking to Roger about finding the car, rebuilding, painting and driving it. The fun part was talking with his daughter and son-in-law about the old guy's other endeavors - the years running a body shop in southern California, building a house, and owning a couple of gold mines, beside all the other British cars he owned. Roger's car is a 1959 TR3A that he restored some years ago. The car started, motored around the neighborhood, stopped, steered quite well, a tribute to Roger's continuing care. It is time for him to sell it in order to help pay for his medical care.

Which brings up the down side. The reality is we are getting on in years and the market, knowledge, and interest is with us, not so much with the youngsters. (Not you, Matt R.) Of my three grandchildren that are old enough to drive, only one is interested in doing so. I understand this is a view held by other youngsters, and is a concern to car makers. I wonder, too, if when trying to put a value on the car, the memories, the excitement, the fun, and the actual blood sweat and tears that into realizing a finished car, colors our thinking. I remember taking my American Flyer train set, Christmas 1954, to Roy's Train World several years ago for an informal price evaluation and walked away so dejected. The guy was brutal, absolutely right, but brutal. He pointed out the places on the all the corners where the paint had worn away, the faded, worn paint where fingers held the engine as I put it on the track, the nicks and scratches that were the result too many off track excursions. As I drove home, I realized I was still seeing the toy with my eight-year-old eyes, not the cold eye of an adult collector. I wonder if that the case with some of us and our Triumphs. We remember the day it rolled out of the garage after months or years of preparation: shiny pain, bright chrome and pride and relief of the completed car.

Rare and valuable? Or just rare. A few weeks ago, I had the opportunity to visit a former club member in Mesa. Her husband died just a few days before our meeting; cancer is so uncaring. The car is a 1952 Triumph Renown; beautiful, shiny black with clean and neat tan interior. Apparently, an Arizona car for a long time - the undercarriage was rust free. There was the requisite few drops of oil on the garage floor. I noticed a small scratch on a fender and some paint bubbles over a door. Still, nothing to make the car undesirable. The problem, as I see it is Hagerty said an average selling price was less than \$8,000. The widow was unhappy with that price suggestion and I agreed that it might sell for substantially more. But still, it brings up the concern that just because a car is rare does not make it stratospherically valuable. Once again, I point to my collection of vehicles. How many DKWs have you seen? Yes, it is rare, but I bought mine for a few hundred dollars, a restored car is still less than a new entry level car. True, the engine was sitting next to the car, and it will need paint and interior, but it was a complete car. Until a few years ago DKWs were just old used cars.

I'm not going to tell the owner that the car is not as valuable as a Concours winning TR3, and I agree the price car could be on the higher. It is clean, apparently well kept, and probably would not need a lot of work to make it safe to drive. The tires are about fifteen years old and maybe the hydraulic system would need attention. The car is a large saloon, right hand drive, surprisingly the interior wood trim is nearly perfect, and the paint is nearly flawless. When we started the car it ran quietly, the steering wheel took much more effort than contemporary cars, and the brake responded as drum brakes do. If I could come up with the cost, I'm thinking, "What a way to arrive at our meetings."
