Desert Centre Triumph Register of America November 2016 DCTRA Meeting Minutes

The November 2016 meeting of the Desert Center Triumph Register of America was called to order by the president, Stu Lasswell, at 7:00 pm at the Denny's Restaurant, Scottsdale Road and Loop 202.

The minutes of the October meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: In the absence of Treasurer Kathy Nuss there was no report, but it is believed that we are solvent.

Members present were Jim Bauder, Michael Blachut, Pete Bowen, Philip Couture, TR6, Jim Craig, George & Chris Durkin, Dave Freet, Bob Holt, John Horton, Craig Kenyon, Armand LaCasse, GT6, Stu Lasswell, TR3, Marvin Miller, TR6, George Montgomery, John Nuss, Mark Peters, TR4A, Pete Peterson, John Reynolds, TR6, Matt Reynolds, Pamela Rineholt, Mike Goodwin. One new member, Jim Craig, was in attendance, as was a guest, Mike Goodwin.

Membership Chairperson Dave Freet reported that we now have 106 memberships with 164 members. Dave is still trying to contact a new member, Ben Trebilcock, who joined through PayPal, but no other information has been received from him. Dave said that it has been reported that about 60% of our members are not receiving email information as some providers' spam blocks our emails. Pam Rineholt reported that she is aware that Gmail blocks some, but not all, of her DCTRA email, so she periodically goes into her spam folder and returns the blocked DCTRA emails to the inbox, which seems to help temporarily. Marvin Miller asked about the inconsistencies in amounts listed in various places for membership, given the recent vote to increase dues to \$20 per year. Dave Freet explained that the increase does not take effect until January, and Dave Riddle said that he will make the changes as needed.

Newsletter Editor George Montgomery requested that anyone who places an ad in the newsletter email him monthly to advise whether the ad should continue or not.

Activities/Vice President Clebe Best was absent, but there are a number of activities listed in the newsletter. Armand LaCasse advised that he will not be able to host the DCTRA Christmas party this year, and a volunteer host was requested. John Horton proposed a Garage Day at his house between Thanksgiving and the December meeting. Stu reminded us that any member would be welcome and encouraged to plan and lead an outing at any time.

Tech Talk: Armand talked about electronics books from Jim Bauder. Craig Kenyon gave away a Triumph shaft and a pattern board for a TR6 wiring harness. Jim Bauder's TR250 had less than 3,000 miles and no hiccups. Stu installed a Petronics flame thrower.

A suggestion was made by Stu to give all Triumphest attendees a plaque, and then award badges to place on the plaque for winners of various events, as was done at the Texoma event he attended. Mike Blachut reported that awards will be trivets.

Old Business: A discussion was held regarding how many charities to which we will make donations, the amount of donations, and which charities we should choose. A motion was made and passed to give \$500 to each of three charities. Several charities were mentioned: Transverse Myelitis Foundation, Andre House, St. Vincent de Paul, Salvation Army, Ronald McDonald House, Hospice of the Valley. Members recalled that last year it was decided that our donations should go to local charities, rather than national or international ones, as having more impact. Therefore, some of the ones that had been suggested were disqualified. John Nuss suggested that the impact is also greater for small rather than large charities. George Montgomery suggested creating a committee to choose the charities, and Craig Kenyon agreed to send an email survey to members to choose three of five charities.

New Business: Nomination of Officers for 2017:

- President: Stu announced that he is moving to North Carolina, so a new president will be needed. John Nuss agreed to accept the nomination.
- Vice-President: Incumbent Clebe Best was nominated in his absence.
- Recording Secretary: Incumbent Pamela Rineholt agreed to accept the nomination, stating that other nominations are more than welcome.
- Treasurer: Incumbent Kathy Nuss (via phone call from husband, John) agreed to accept the nomination.
- Further nominations for all offices will be entertained in December.

Dave Freet announced that he will be unable to continue as Membership Chairperson next year. Marvin Miller agreed to accept the position.

Pete Bowen agreed to attend the east valley Hobbyist Council meetings when they resume. John Horton agreed to keep him informed.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:52 pm.

Meet Our Members

I was 21 and my brother, Tony, was 19, when we painted my car in early June of 1971. We did a decent job and tried a paint scheme that we thought was "cool". This was our first experience with painting a car and it looked good from 20 ft.







After painting the car, we felt really proud and as we were sitting around talking one evening, we concluded that evening, that we needed to take a trip somewhere. We each checked in at our jobs and they agreed to let each of us have a week off, so in July of 1971, we decided to go out to Yellowstone National Park and back from Northern KY, in just one week's time.

The car was originally fitted with the stamped steel wheels and the "skinny" bias belt tires. They were worn and I needed a new set. I went over to the Triumph Dealer in Cincinnati, Ohio, to get a new set of tires. After getting there and describing my desires, they also showed me a set of NEW CHROME rims, made by Rader. Needless to say, I bought them and went to a tire dealer and had a set of radial tires put on. Those are what you see in the pictures.

On the trip to Yellowstone we camped along the way and were being as economical as possible (my money was tight after paying for the paint materials, new rims and tires). Everything went fine until we hit Nebraska. We had 2 breakdowns along the way in the state of Nebraska.

They were both related to one of the carburetors flooding out, due to the float needle and seat having stripped treads. I had some gasket maker in the tool kit I took along, put some on the damaged threads and this worked for a short time. The final fix lasted the rest of the trip. It was tearing a very small piece from one of my T- shirts and soaking this in the gasket maker, wrapping it around the damaged threads and screwing the seat assembly back in. Just one of the many creative fixes I had to do over the years while owning a LBC.

We had a great time in Yellowstone. Many people talked to us about the car and took pictures of us next to it. We even got pulled over by a Police officer outside of Yellowstone Park. We were very concerned, when the lights came on. After we pulled over to the side of the road, I asked him what we were doing wrong. He said: "I thought I saw something white on your windshield, which could have blocked your view and could cause an accident!" We assured him, we did not have anything white on our dash or in the front seat area. He then gave us a big smile and said; "There wasn't anything there, I just wanted to see your car and talk to you". This TR3 was more popular than we could ever be. We talked for a few minutes and he wished us a safe trip.

On our return trip back through Nebraska the car started to shake. As we got closer to Kentucky it was shaking quite vigorously. Thinking about this, it might have started after we hit a really big pot hole around dusk. It was about 1 1/2 feet in diameter and about 4 inches deep. I had a trunk rack, which was held on by suction cups and 2 straps. After hitting this hole, which my brother didn't see, we were notified by the "BANG" and the trunk rack flew off the car and it skidded down the road, grinding off 2 of the rubber suction cups. We saw sparks as it skid across the road. I had purchased that trunk rack new from J.C. Whitney. It held our Coleman stove and various other items safely as it was ground to bits.

It makes me smile every time I hear the word Nebraska, as it takes me back to that glorious trip with my brother. Bringing those memories flooding back and my mind's eye reliving the issues we experienced, as we crossed through this state.

Whenever my brother Tony and I would get together and talk about our cars, this trip, which we took together, would come up and we always agreed, that after we retired, we were going to take and relive that trip again. That trip we took together, will always hold a special place in my heart and mind. My brother passed away in July of 2015 from brain cancer; so now, that trip can only be repeated in my memories!

That trip was the highlight of my ownership of this car to date. We made it home, but had to go at a much slower speed, to keep the car from vibrating apart. We found that the rear universal joint needle bearings were damaged. They were dry and there was rust within them. Who knows when they were last lubricated? It definitely was not me! There was a lot to do and check out on my car after such a fun and grueling 1 week, 3500-mile trip.

After arriving home and checking over the car, in depth, I found a small crack in the engine block, between the #2 and #3 cylinders and there was antifreeze weeping out of this crack. This really sent a wave of depression over me. I showed this to my Dad and he said; "I am sorry Bob, but that cannot be fixed. You are going to need a new engine block" So along with going over to the local Triumph Dealers in Cincinnati, Ohio to see about getting my carburetors repaired and new universal joints for the drive shaft, I now had to ask about a new engine block.

Back then, in 1971, as I found out and others know, getting parts was horrible from the Triumph dealers. They didn't have any new parts for the TR3 carbs. However they had a set of used TR4 Stromberg carbs, which I traded even up – at no cost. Luckily, they had new universal joints, but a new block would have to come over from England, at a cost that was way out of my meager budget range. One of the counter people thought they had a used block out back. He left for a while and came back and said they had one. It didn't have any cracks, but it had been burning oil and needed new cylinder sleeves and piston rings and who knows what else. It was at this point that I was beginning to understand, the frustrations of owning one of these cars, and why, the person I bought the car from, was tired of it and willing to sell it to someone.

I believed that I didn't have a choice, so I bought the used block and universal joints and took them home along with the Stromberg carbs. This car was going to bankrupt me I thought. However, I still loved the car and was not going to give up on it. So, I ordered, a complete set of cylinder liners, piston and rings, bearings, etc. and a complete gasket set from J.C. Whitney. With my Dad and my Brother Tony's help we took out the engine, and dis-mantled it. We kept all the parts, to re-use them with the used block. (That is a story all in itself).

Looking back over this, I wish I had kept the original engine block, because technology today would have allowed the block to be repaired. However, at the time, my Dad was building a 2 ½ car garage and the engine block got tossed in with the fill dirt and gravel and is resting under the concrete slab.

I was able to get my car back up and running with these 3 repairs. Being 21 at the time, along with the replacement parts issues from Triumph, I didn't have much choice in going this direction, especially with the carb issue. The Stromberg carbs, stayed on my car until 1985, after I took it out of storage from the garage in 1984 at my mother's house. It had sat in there from early September of 1972 when I got married. In 1984 my mother called me to say that I had to come get my car. Since my Dad died in April of 1978 she just couldn't keep up with the house anymore and was going to sell it.

Upon taking it out in June of 1984, I wanted to go back to the original SU carbs. At this same time, I had a 1967 175CC Bridgestone Motorcycle and I put an advertisement in the Cincinnati Enquirer to buy a set of TR3A carbs. After someone called me about this, we got to talking and he said he had a set. He also had an original tan factory convertible top, which had a small tear in it (I still have this top and hope to see about getting it repaired someday) and other misc. items. After telling him about my Bridgestone motorcycle, we decided to do a trade. Now I had a set of period correct carbs, with parts now being available, I rebuilt them. We both went away very happy with our items.

In the late spring of 1986, I painted my car Porch red. My best friend John and his 16 yr. old son, "little" John, were over helping me take out the engine on a Saturday morning, because I wanted to paint and detail it and the engine bay. I was surprised when another good friend, Tim, who was restoring his 1957 Corvette dropped by that morning also, to show me his finished car. He tried to convince me to do a full body off restoration like he did. I said; "Tim, that sounds good, but all I want to do is clean up and paint the engine and engine bay, so I can drive it". Well......after the 3 adults

had numerous beers, Tim's persistence, paid off. By the end of that day, the body was off the car and the front suspension was apart. The influence of alcohol took its toll and put me behind by years, in being able to drive my car. My goal was to fix it up as I went along. The smile on my face was there, due to the beers still having their effect and keeping me from the reality I later saw and felt when I sobered up. A lesson well learned!!!





Many other sagas can be told, as part of my ownership of this beautiful 1960 Triumph TR3A. It has been a "never ending story" and one in which, I think the relationship is the other way around: she owns me. And it all started when she called out to me that Friday evening in August of 1969.




