

## **Technical Corner**

This hobby isn't for sissies, By John Heisser

In February I drove my TR8 to the "Pancakes in the Park" breakfast run, I arrived at 32nd Street & Shea and discovered I had a really bad oil leak so I left the car parked there and rode with Armand to breakfast. Afterward we stop by his house to pick up 2 quarts of oil. He took me back to the car and I headed home.

Upon inspection I discovered the front engine oil seal around vibration damper hub had come out. The replacement seal was less than \$10.00, easy fix, right? However, this is what happened. To remove the vibration damper, I had to remove 3 drive pulleys, a double idler pulley and all the belts. With all removed, there is just enough room to place a 1" socket, a 2" extension and ½" drive breaker bar, to remove the bolt that holds the vibration damper in place. No matter what I tried, this bolt would not break loose, so I need to use an impact wrench. To make room for the impact wrench I had to remove the radiator, the lower radiator support and the electric fans (2) assembly. Now that I had room for the impact wrench, I adjusted my compressor pressure regulator to max 110 PSI, after trying for several minutes the bolt would not budge. So, I purchased a new impact wrench with the highest torque available thinking my 40-year old one was a little worn out. Should have saved my money because the bolt still would not budge.

I was tired and had run out of ideas so I decided to take a few days to think about how to go about getting that @\$!#%&\* bolt loose. After a few phone calls to companies and suppliers that specialize in TR7 & 8s no one had ever had a problem like this but suggested several theories as to the cause.

I determined that since the engine crankshaft was not locked in place the engine was absorbing some of the torque the impact gun was producing. So, I fabricated a plate that would bolt to the vibration dampener with a slip tube for a piece square tube to fit in and slide over to the frame of the car. With the engine crankshaft now locked in place I again used the impact wrench to try and loosen the bolt. After several tries letting the compressor recharge to maximum pressure each time, still no luck, the bolt would not budge. Having taken that few days to think about how to get the bolt loose, I also had a plan "B". Plan "B" was to make a long extension for my 3/4" drive breaker bar with this extension this gave me about a 6' long lever. To be able to use such a long lever I had to come down from the top of the engine, it cleared the hood, but the water pump had to be removed. With everything in place, I got on a ladder, (the car was raised on blocks) I place one foot on the valve cover the other on the ladder, firmly grab the bar and PULLED! The bar moved about 2 feet which I estimate turned the bolt about 1/8", reset the socket and pulled another 2 feet, then finished removing the bolt with the impact wrench.





## **Technical Corner (cont.)**







The reason the bolt was so hard to get loose was someone coated the threads and shoulder of the bolt and the flat washer with silicone sealer which glued it in place. The opposite should have been done, a few drops of oil or a dab of anti-seize to facilitate the removal of the bolt, the next time it was necessary. All is back together with no major oil leaks, only an occasional drop. Hopefully, the accompanying photos will clarity to what I have written. Now moving on to the fuel system.......

## **Complimentary Additional Year of Membership!**

2020 has been a difficult year to meet in person, socialize, and create the "Triumph-people connections" that support belonging to DCTRA.

The DCTRA Executive Leadership Team met on Saturday, October 24, 2020, at Surprise Community Park after the Bring Your Own Brunch - Off to the Races Drive to consider a proposal for unusual action. President John Heisser, Vice President John Nuss, Secretary Mary White, and Treasurer Armand LaCasse discussed 2021 membership dues and **unanimously agreed**:

- DCTRA will not collect any membership renewal dues in 2021.
- Every member as of December 31, 2020 will have one year of membership added to their membership expiration date.

If your membership would have expired in 2021, now it will expire in 2022. 2022 membership expirations move to 2023. And 2023 membership expirations move to 2024.

**How much will this cost?** Our membership dues income average is \$1800 per year. We estimate a one-year membership renewal extension would be a loss of \$1600 in membership renewal income in 2021. We expect some new members will join during the 2021 year and the usual membership renewal periods would apply.




