



Next month's Run will be sponsored by the Lotus Club. DCTRA's turn comes in May, so be ready.



EDITOR AT PLAY

We foreign car drivers used to wave to each other as a congratulation for not driving Detroit iron. A unwritten social order developed, governing who waves first, assuming simultaneous recognition. 
