

Driving to last part into Superior we waved to the Dynamic MINI Collective drivers heading south while the rest of the Triumph collage returned at our own pace.


Election Brunch

Groundhog Day was first celebrated in this country as a Pennsylvania German custom in the southeastern and central portions of Pennsylvania during the 18th century. According to folklore, brought here from Europe, if it is cloudy when a groundhog emerges from its burrow on February 2^{nd,} then spring will come early; if it is sunny and the groundhog sees his shadow and will retreat back into its burrow for six more weeks of winter. FOR SALE: 1965 Triumph Herald


