Membership Chairperson Dave Freet reported that we now have one new member, Joe Policastro, bringing us to 107 memberships with 163 members. Marvin Miller will be our new membership chairperson.

The minutes of the December meeting were approved as printed in the newsletter.

Treasurer's Report: Treasurer Kathy Nuss sent a report, indicating that we are solvent.

Meet Our Members

Way back in the mid-nineties, my late husband, Clay, who was a cabinet-maker, was doing free-lance renovation work, and agreed to take a "basket-case" TR3 as partial payment on one of his jobs. We then joined DCTRA and got acquainted with some of the early members of the club. This was a very busy time in our lives, and, for me, it was a great way to have a date night with my husband once a month, as we attended the meetings without friends and family who were often with us wherever we went. It was also fun to get acquainted with the great people we were meeting in DCTRA and to learn about these fabulous British cars. I don't recall how long we stayed in the club then, but we eventually got even more busy and dropped out.

In late spring or early summer of 2004, on a Friday, I saw a new Mini Cooper in a local parking lot. When I got home, I asked Clay to guess what I had seen, and he did. We made an appointment to go to Scottsdale on Sunday to test drive a new Mini. Later in the evening, Clay said, "You know we can't afford to buy a new Mini, so why don't we go back and look at that 1949 Triumph Roadster we saw in Tucson?" I agreed, having already been drooling over the gorgeous old car. It happened that my mom and I were already planning to go to Tucson the next day, so we cancelled the test drive, and added a visit to British Car Service in Tucson to my itinerary on Saturday. As I was getting ready to leave on Saturday morning, Clay said, "Maybe I'll meet you at the car lot," which I knew meant that he would be there when I arrived.

By the time my mom and I got to British Car Service, Clay had not only taken a good close look at the Roadster, but also scoped out a beautiful laurel green TR6 that was sitting in their show room. He told me the TR6 would just fit me, and had me to go sit in the driver's seat. He was right — it did just fit me! We went on home and talked about which one of the two lovely Triumphs we should get. We had pretty much fallen in love with the TR6, but decided that the Roadster was the car for us since it fit Clay as well as me, and the great dickey seat would give us the ability to take friends along on our outings. We came to an agreement with British Car Service to purchase the Roadster, running and stopping, as I insisted we not bring home any more cars that didn't run! When we went to pick up the Roadster, I was the one who got to drive it first, moving it from one side of the car lot to the other.

Right away, we joined DCTRA again, and we had a great time taking the Roadster to events such as the Highland games and Breakfast Runs, and getting re-acquainted with the great DCTRA members. Unfortunately, in the fall of 2004, Clay's mother became ill, and he ended up staying with her in Maryland for over a year. My daily driver, a Chevy Beretta, went with him, and he told me I needed another car to drive, and asked if I would like to find another Beretta or buy the TR6. It took me all of

about a millisecond to choose the TR6, although I did eventually get another Beretta to use as a daily driver. So, I made the deal with British Car Service to bring home the cute LBC that "just fit me." This time, I drove it home myself, and became convinced that this car was, indeed, meant for me! In the fall of 2005, Clay came home to finish sprucing up the TR6 so we could take it to Triumphest in Lake Tahoe. That is a whole other story! I will just say my Beretta ended up beat to a pulp, I missed the plane to Reno, we drove all night to get to Tahoe just in time to get the TR6 on the line for the show, and I locked my shoes along with my keys in my suitcase before the Awards Banquet! That was a memorable trip. The TR6 did come home with a Gold, however.

Sadly, Clay passed away in 2006, but I remained more or less active in DCTRA, taking the TR6 to several events, and winning another award or two along the way. The Roadster really needed a full restoration, which I was not equipped to accomplish, so I sold it to a gentleman in the Midwest, who had plans to bring it to a 100-point condition and enter it in the **Pebble** Beach Concours d'Elegance. Unfortunately, when I moved from Apache Junction to Mesa, I lost contact with him, and never received my promised invitation to go see the car in the show. I had a great surprise the evening of January 24, 2017, when the gentleman who bought the car from me called to tell me he had just finished the restoration and the Triumph Roadster Club in the UK has declared this car the 'finest example in existence'.







After becoming a retired "lady of leisure," I accepted the position of DCTRA Secretary to prevent my inherent laziness in getting out of the house in the evenings to attend meetings. The members of DCTRA have been some of my dear friends and acquaintances through the years whom I treasure and appreciate, such as when they put the TR6 back together and got it back home for me after Clay died, and when they came out to Apache Junction to identify and haul away the many pieces of the TR3 and identify for me to keep the odds and ends that belonged to the TR6.

As much as I love and treasure the TR6, I have concluded that it requires someone with a modicum of mechanical aptitude to do it justice, so I am willing to entertain proposals to transfer its ownership to another responsible Triumph aficionado. To soothe my pain, and to keep me in with the British car in-crowd, I recently purchased Debbie Laswell's Jaguar XJ6, not our first Jag, by the way, as we had an XJ40 when Clay died, another among the fleet of non-running cars that I moved out following his untimely death. I look forward to keeping active with my friends in DCTRA for years to come!


