Prez Sez - April

Last month Charisse and I celebrated our 17th wedding anniversary on June 15th. My sister and her husband celebrated their 50th anniversary. Because of other commitments each of us had neither of us could get together on "the day" so we decided to meet at the next best. Last week Charisse and I flew to Albuquerque to meet with Jenny and Bob. Bob had been an US Air Force captain stationed there back in the '70's for 3-4 years. They are familiar with ABQ, which made for a great time exploring that city and all of its offerings. We rode a local trolley; touring Old Town and the rest of that city hearing all of the history and folk lore of the area. There were a lot of interesting and surprising facts about ABQ, and guess what? They are as proud of their city as we are ours.

We spent one day taking a light rail train to Santa Fe, a beautiful little city in the mountains at about 7,200 ft. ABQ is at 5,400 ft which makes for fairly pleasant days and cool evenings, much like our Prescott. Two things unique about New Mexico are that adobe housing and structures are encouraged and sometime required and that the state has resolved never to tear down any of their old historic buildings, but to refurbish, renew and repurpose them; some waiting for years for someone's inspiration. A huge and historic railroad manufacture and repair facility has sat for 15-20 years for some such ideal. It has broken glass panes, rusted frame work and siding, but it earns the city several hundred thousand per year as various film producers rent it as the backdrop for their movies. The Matrix series to name one; I wish I could remember the others. The tour guide pointed our several houses and buildings that were (and are) used for at least a dozen movies and TV shows.

As we left Santa Fe (it was a Friday about 4:30PM) there were a number of Mustangs and '50-'60's cars began appearing downtown around the plaza. They eventually began to park around the plaza backed in, in the usual car display for-

mation. They were getting ready for a car show of what appeared to be all manner of cars. I wish we had known that there was to be a car show that day. I wished that we could have waited for the next train, an hour later. Waiting for our shuttle bus to take us back to the train, I saw a very pretty TR3; an Inca yellow with camel interior about ½ blocks away. I started to walk over to it just as our shuttle arrived. It was the only Triumph that I saw the whole trip.

While Charisse and I traveled this country for 15 years in our motorhome, I used to keep track of the number of Triumphs that we saw. There weren't many, 1-2 per week if you look in the right places, seems there more when we first started, 1995, than during the later years 2008-10. They're an uncommon sight indeed anymore. I hope Triumphs on the road such as vintage Healeys, Jags and other obscure marquees don't become so rare that they are only seen at annual shows and museums.

Another day, in ABQ, was spent with Bob and I at the Unser Racing Museum. The Unser claim ABQ as their home. I have some photos to be included in this newsletter if Dave has room for them.

We'll see you at the July business meeting on July 10th, and I'll be driving Jack with his new interior this time. Yeah!!!!



Unser Racing Museum

On a recent trip to Albuquerque, NM, I had a chance to tour the Unser Racing Museum. It is located on a boulevard near the middle of the city in two buildings. It has memorabilia of the who family's racing career: Grandfather, Louis, Sr., son Jerry, Sr. and sons Bobby, Al, Sr., Jerry, Jr. and all of their sons.

Louis, being especially skilled in the emerging automobile engine industry instilled an interest in automobiles and racing. They started at nearby Pikes Peak in 1916, then added racing on dirt tracks then pavement. They eventually moved on to racing at Indianapolis. The family moved to Albuquerque during the Depression to start an automobile repair business. Grandfather Louis, Sr. and son were each involved various phases of the auto racing industry.



The Unser family first immigrated from Switzerland to Colorado Springs, CO not long after the turn of the 20th Century. Granddad,



The museum is filled with examples of the various race cars arranged in all of the various categories that they ran. There is one room devoted to trophies only. If you are ever in Albuquerque, it is well worth the \$10 admission (\$6 for active military and seniors).






