The Horton Family Triumphs

I started out in 1962 with a brand new RED TR4 off the showroom floor in Indianapolis. I drove that car for a number of years as my main transportation, and on weekends raced it at Indianapolis Raceway Park and Mid-Ohio Raceway. Then I met Beth, who was driving a 1954 Austin A40. Beth bought a second Austin to use for parts. We married in 1964, and as our family grew, I traded the TR4 to a friend for a Volkswagen sedan.

After twenty years, and the move to Phoenix, our oldest son started driving and found a 1979 TR7 that we restored. Eventually it went the way of the failed head syndrome. We replaced the engine and gearbox with a Toyota 18RGR and 5 speed. This was a successful transplant, so I thought it would work for me. I found a TR7 body and did the same.



About 1984 Beth & I joined the DCTRA with that car. I raced it a PIR and Firebird. After losing two engines, it was retired, and I found a 1981 TR8 waiting in a storage yard. At various times we also owned a TR7 Spyder, a TR7 Victory, and a few others. Beth drove her 1979 Spitfire 1500 to several Triumphests. Each of our four children owned Triumphs at some time in their lives and learned to work on them: a Stag, a Spitfire, and a few TR7's.

In 1998 I found a 1976 TR6 for sale on a street corner and added it to the herd. The owner had an offer from someone who wanted to take it to Holland and dismantle it for parts. He actually took a lower offer from me with the promise that I would keep it and enjoy it, as we have. Later we changed its four speed for a VanDenAker 5 speed gearbox, a very good thing.

After all those British cars in the family, we have settled down to the TR8, TR6, and the Locost that I built. Later we assembled a shop behind the house to work on and service our herd.

They have been our companions on a lot of adventures with the DCTRA. John Horton

Hats off to John Reynolds. He gave me some plastic panel material that I could use to reline my trunk. I added some craft foam, some carpet from Tempe Sales and a piece of plywood. I have a narrow width tire for a spare and when mounted upside down, a piece of plywood fits flat across the spare tire well. A little bit of the craft foam makes the sides flat and now my trunk has a flat floor. I added in some LED lighting for at night and some easy removable covers to access the taillight bulbs.


