How I Became Involved With Triumphs

Hello my name is Dave Freet. My first experience with Triumphs was back in 1971 when my uncle John bought his first 1966 TR4A. Over the next few years he bought 3 more TR4S I do not remember all the years but each one was a different color and most were in rough condition. We spend nights and weekends repairing them. We had a great time working on them and driving them all over the Pennsylvania country side. Then Uncle Sam called and John joined the Air Force causing him to sell his collection. Shortly thereafter I got married and started a family. After raising 4 children to adulthood I decided I would like to have a sports car again.

In 2010 I bought a 1979 MGB and rebuild it but it did not give me the connection that I was seeking to the past. So I sold the MGB and started my hunt for a Triumph. I have always wanted a TR250 but after looking for about a year the only ones I found were so rough or out of my price range that I started looking at TR6s after looking at about 50 different TR6s on line I finally saw one in Scottsdale that had all the items I wanted. Although I probably paid too much for her she had all the options and was in decent condition. My requirements were no rust, overdrive, bumper over riders, hardtop, wire wheels, and mostly original equipment. She is a 1971 model per the title but has a build date of Aug 1970 and was purchased by the original owner from Tucson imports 1540 E Broadway,

Tucson, AZ on 04-07-1971. I have been trying to do a time line on her whole life but I have had no luck with the DMV in trying to track the previous owners. Since I bought her I have installed new thrust washers, rear lever shocks, rebuild the factory distributor, installed new rear coil springs, repaired the POS issues and did an complete check and service. I joined the DCTRA club in April of 2014 and after a few months of membership became the membership chairperson.

Since buying her my wife and I have enjoyed putting about 5000 miles on her driving around the state. The adventure continues and I encourage anyone that enjoys these great cars to dig the one you have out of the garage or go find one that you can repair and join us on the road. I hope to see you at a meeting or an upcoming event in the near future.




