Technical Corner


Simple Diode Modifications

Here' are a couple of easy modifications using diodes with application to old British cars. A diode is a "one-way valve" to the flow of electrical current, so can be used to isolate circuits or protect them. A diode has two ratings, Continuous current, and Peak Inverse Voltage (PIV). Diodes useful to us can have a rating of 10 Amps "10A" or more, depending on the application, and should always be at least 400 Volts, "400V" regardless of where they are used on a car.

This is how current flows through them:

Their electrical symbol:

And they look like this:



<u>Specification:</u> An old car's electrical system is a hostile environment for anything other than the technology of the period it was designed. With that in mind:


Current Rating: Take the wattage of the consumer (lamp, fan motor, etc.) and divide it by twelve if your car has a 12V system; divide by six for a 6V system. It doesn't matter if the car is positive or negative ground. As an example: A 12V radiator fan consumes 100 Watts, so 100/12 = 8 Amps. Sometimes the rating label of the device is already given in Amps, so just use that number directly. Now, any diode you choose must be able to withstand <u>inrush</u>. This is the current drawn when a consumer like a motor or incandescent bulb is turned on, and can typically be about three times the normal operating current. Most diodes can withstand a much higher current that their continuous current for a short time.


Voltage Rating Diodes also need to handle voltage spikes. These are generated by electric motors in fans and pumps being turned off. They don't like being switched off suddenly, so will generate a reverse voltage to oppose the change in current through them. This is called "inductive kickback" and can give you a nasty shock as well as targeting devices connected to the wiring nearby. These short transients can exceed 200V. So when choosing a diode, it's important to choose a much higher voltage value to protect against spikes.

For example, Amazon carries the "Bojack 20A10" diode with a continuous rating of 20 A but can withstand 400 A for a few thousandths of a second (milliseconds). And they're \$7.99 for twenty!

Below are some common applications:

Application No. 1: <u>Back feed</u> Sometimes, a fan motor will continue to spin after the car is shut off and generate a voltage that can keep some other part of the car's circuit running. Putting a diode in series with the feed to the motor will eliminate that.







Application
No. 2: Spike
protection Inductive

kickback from turning off a strongly inductive load like a fuel pump generates a voltage spike in the opposite direction. A diode used as a "snubber" provides a path for this current to flow, dissipating the energy safely and preventing damage to other components

Application No. 3: <u>Heat soak</u> <u>prevention</u> After shutting a car off, the under-bonnet temperature will rise because the fan is no longer running but the engine is still hot. The addition of two diodes will keep the fan running – even when the car is shut off – until the thermoswitch no longer calls for cooling. If originality is important, the diodes can be fitted inside the relay case.





Packaging a diode Cut the diode wires short and solder some stranded wire onto the cut ends, using a pair of fine-nose pliers as a heat sink to protect the device. Cover with a piece of 3:1 glue-lined heath shrink to insulate it overall. Use the same gauge of wire as the circuit into which it is to be spliced.

Tech Tips for a Long Distance Drive

The main difference between the usual driving we do in our TR's and the long distance drive is sustained speed. This means all things that go around go around faster for more time. Wheel bearings, water pump bearings, drivelines, axles, fan belts, and alternators all need to be checked before leaving. A small leak at 50 mph is a big leak at 70 mph, more gas than you have used in the past year is going thru the fuel system in 3 days, so filters should be clean and a spare should be carried. Radiator and heater hoses are going to be tested so check and replace before you leave. The things that I consider givens or already in good condition are the cooling system, the brakes, all lights, oil pressure, tires and balance (6 days shaking down the road at speed is not fun!) All filters should be fresh so you don't need to change them on the road, if something is not up to scratch don't bring a replacement on the trip, change it in your own garage, not the side of the road.

Just for reference, in the past three trips of this nature only a wiper blade blew off, a Speedo cable broke, a TR 3 tie-rod end came apart, and a set of points burned out on a TR 8. All were repaired or ignored on the move and all TR's made it home under their own power. Not bad for over 10,000 miles in very old cars.

The worst that could happen, short of a bad accident, is a major component giving up and the TR is immobilized. The fix? Remember this is worst case. Get out your credit card, rent a U-Haul truck, insert one TR, drive back to Seattle and tell all your friends some outrageous story for why you came home early. Much more probable is a phone call to Moss, or the Roadster Factory, or Victoria British to order the part and have it shipped to the next hotel so you can give a tech session in the parking lot.


